WHAT IS LIFE?

A Freemason's Guide to the Universe.(Part III)

Reincarnation – another figment of the imagination?

It must be stated quite categorically that reincarnation is NOT a Masonic doctrine (if there be such a thing as a "Masonic doctrine"). Actually, it is doubtful that reincarnation per se can be formulated into a doctrine at all. It either happens or it does not happen, without an individual willing it to be so – or not so. The reason we are investigating it is because, if there is any hint that souls do in fact, reincarnate, then it would be another clue that humans possess an immortal spark within them. And that is really what all these articles are about. So, let us see what the late Dr. Ian Stevenson, the acclaimed expert on past-life recall, had to say.

"In many parts of the world, some young children, usually between the ages of 2 and 5, speak about a previous life they claim to have lived. At the same time they often show behavior, such as a phobia, that is unusual in their family and/or not explained by any current life events but that seems concordant with the child's statements about a previous life. In many cases of this type the child's statements have been shown to correspond accurately to facts in the life and death of a deceased person; in many of these cases the families concerned have had no contact before the case developed. Some of the children have birthmarks and birth defects that correspond to wounds or other marks on the deceased person whose life a child remembers. In numerous cases postmortem reports have confirmed these correspondences. Older children may retain these apparent memories, but generally they seem to fade around the age of 7." see Dr. Stevenson's website:

A typical example of past-life recall is the case of Parmod Sharma.

Parmod Sharma was born on October 11, 1944, in Bisauli, India. When Parmod was about two and a half, he began telling his mother not to cook his meals for him any longer because he had a wife in Moradabad who could cook. Moradabad was a town about a ninety miles northeast of Bisauli. Between the ages of three and four, he began to speak in detail of his life there. He described several businesses he had owned and operated with other members of his family. He particularly spoke of a shop that manufactured and sold biscuits (cookies) and soda water,

calling it "Mohan Brothers." He insisted that he was one of the "Mohan Brothers" and that he also had a business in Saharanpur, a town about a hundred miles north of Moradabad.

Parmod tended not to play with the other children in Bisauli but preferred to play by himself, building models of shops complete with electrical wiring. He especially liked to make mud biscuits which he served his family with tea or soda water. During this time he provided many details about his shop including its size and location in Moradabad, what was sold there, and his activities connected to it, such as his business trips to Delhi. He even complained to his parents about the less prosperous financial condition of their home compared to what he was used to as a successful merchant. Parmod had a strong distaste for curd, which is quite unusual for an Indian child, and on one occasion even advised his father against eating it, saying that it was dangerous. Parmod said that in his other life he had become seriously ill after eating too much curd one day. He had an equally strong dislike for being submerged in water, which might relate to his report that he had previously "died in a bathtub." Parmod said that he had been married and had five children--four sons and one daughter. He was anxious to see his family again and frequently begged his parents to take him to back Moradabad to visit them. His family always refused his request, though his mother did get him to begin school by promising to take him to Moradabad when he had learned to read.

Parmod's parents never investigated or tried to verify their son's claims, perhaps because of the Indian folk custom that children who remembered a previous life were fated to die early. News of Parmod's statements, however, eventually reached the ears of a family in Moradabad named Mehra which fit many of the details of his story. The brothers of this family owned several businesses in Moradabad including a biscuit and soda water shop named "Mohan Brothers." The shop had been started and managed by Parmanand Mehra until his untimely death on May 9, 1943, eighteen months before Parmod was born. Parmanand had gorged himself on curd, one of his favorite foods, at a wedding feast, and had subsequently developed a chronic gastrointestinal illness followed later by appendicitis and peritonitis from which he died. Two or three days before his death, he had insisted, against his family's advice, on eating more curd saying that he might not have another chance to enjoy it. Parmanand had blamed his illness and impending death on overeating curd. As part of his therapy during his appendicitis, Parmanand had tried a series of naturopathic bath treatments. While he had not in fact died in a bathtub, he had been given a bath immediately prior to his death. Parmanand left a widow and five children--four sons and one daughter.

In the summer of 1949, the Mehra family decided to make the trip to Bisauli to meet Parmod, who was a little under five years old at the time. When they arrived, however, Parmod was away with his family and no contact was made. Shortly thereafter, Parmod's father responded to an invitation from the Mehra family and took him to Moradabad to explore his son's compelling remembrances first hand

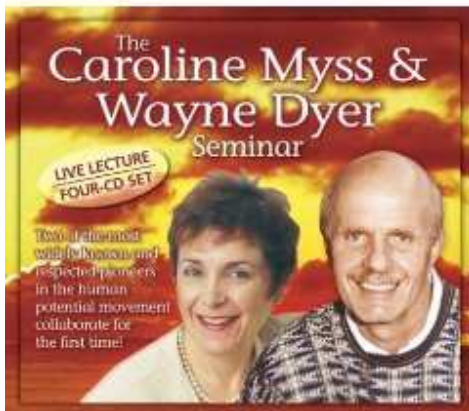

BIBLIOPHILE- Book Review:

I'm writing this piece with only one hand because of the pain that can only come from an Editor twisting my arm for his monthly book review. I explained, through gritted teeth that I wasn't busy with any Masonic books this month; but



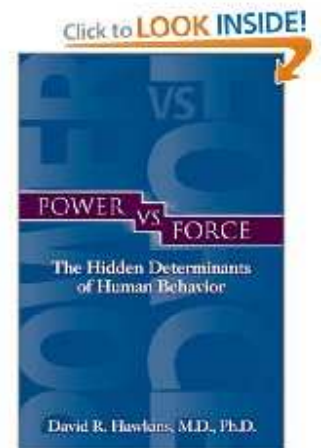
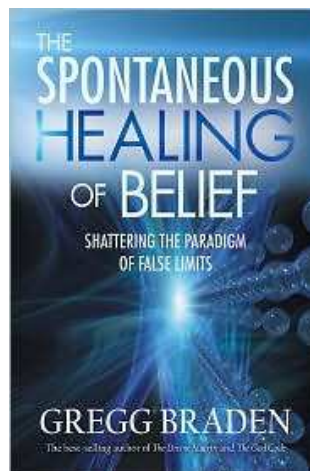
he wasn't having any. Through his gentle [sic] ministrations, I was made to believe that I had indeed been reading stuff of Masonic value – that undefined area called “the hidden

mysteries of

science and nature”. This particular reading/listening saga began a couple of years ago when I bought the Caroline Myss & Wayne Dyer Seminar (see below). It's about spirituality, as opposed to religion. Caroline is the only person on Earth who speaks more forthrightly than the DGM ... But she is still probably

the best teacher of spirituality and self-honesty in the world today: better even than House.

Wayne Dyer, however was a revelation to me. He studied under Maslow (not actually *in* the Pyramid) and is a great teacher on how to be the best person you can be. So



between them, they

cater for the whole gamut of Masonic moral education.

In this particular work, Dyer talks about energy. Energy as in “vibes”, and also as in sub-atomic physics. He makes so much use of Hawkins's book “Power vs. force” that I just had to get it to read for myself. It was more than worth it. For years I had wondered why a good Working was such a powerful tonic. I also couldn't get out of my mind the first Working I attended after Initiation – an Installation. Part of my cynical mind was noticing how silly we all looked; part of my mind was asking: “If we look so silly, why does this whole Masonry thing feel so *right*?”

Hawkins has at last answered my question. It's all about energy. When you get to the smallest sub-atomic particle, you can't spilt it anymore; it's just energy. Everything in Creation was made with energy, *is* energy, and both responds to and generates energy – electromagnetic energy. Some energy levels replenish us and lift us to higher levels of Spirit – like Brotherly Love, the Harmony which unites us, the splendid fellowship in a fine Lodge. These he calls Power. Other emotions can have a lethal energetic effect, such as shame, anger and guilt. This is referred to as Force. I learnt at last what lies at the bottom of Freemasonry at its best – our floor Workings and ritual actually heighten our sense of Brotherhood, and enhance the transformation of our Morality. I thus unreservedly recommend this book. But serendipity wasn't finished with me yet. There is, apparently, a whole genre of literature out there which links spirituality and science.

I was brought up in an era when, to be a Believer meant that I had to endure the scorn of true scientists: that Science and Religion were mortal enemies.

Nowadays, although we still have scientists like the late Carl Sagan, who set themselves up as high-class theologians, there are more and more like a certain local nuclear scientist who is also a Reiki Master. These people have studied science and nature, and have come to the conclusion that there is a direct and close link between science and spirituality (if not between science and *all* religious dogma). Science and God aren't enemies after all.

This brings me to my latest purchase on this subject – The Spontaneous Healing of Belief, by Gregg Braden. The title sounds like it could have been written by one of those “Name-it-and-claim-it” preachers; but it is based on serious science. He begins with quantum physics – the gap between atoms. It isn’t, he shows, a simple vacuum, but part of a universe-wide interlocking network of energy – of which we are an integral part. He calls this the Divine Matrix (shades of the Kaballah, here).

Using the old quantum physics truth that there are no “observers”, but that the act of observing changes the thing observed, he shows that our link to the universe is through our consciousness and intent.

It really is “mind over matter”: the energy within our personal systems interacting with those around us. Einstein is quoted as referring to this connectedness as “spooky action at a distance.”

It would appear, indeed, that there are still mysteries in science and nature for Freemasons to explore, and, in so doing, make themselves into more perfect ashlar, destined for that Spiritual Temple.

The Brethren of every Lodge, but especially the Master and Wardens, are enjoined to visit other Lodges as often as they conveniently can.

Brethren visiting Lodges must provide themselves with written evidence that they are in good standing. Brethren going overseas, temporarily or permanently, should ascertain from Grand Secretary the Masonic Bodies recognised as regular by Grand Lodge.

Freemasons' legal fight rocks secret society- Father and son take unprecedented action over 'appalling conduct of management'

The internal workings of one of the most secretive institutions in [Ireland](#), the Masonic Order, may be publicly exposed after a writ was issued in the High Court in [Belfast](#) against a Provincial Lodge master and the general secretary in [Dublin](#). News of the unprecedented legal action comes as The Lost [Symbol](#), the new novel by [Dan Brown](#) about the pursuit of "ancient mysteries" hidden in [Washington DC](#) by the Freemasons, hit the shelves and sold millions in its first week of publication. The legal proceedings by father and son Stewart and [Brian Hood](#) has rocked the arcane world of the Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons of Ireland. Neither party would discuss the issues behind the High Court action, but sources within the Masonic say it relates to serious disagreements and disciplinary actions within the Antrim Provincial Lodge that arose more than two years ago. A writ naming [Barry Lyons](#), the grand secretary of the Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons in Ireland, whose headquarters is in Molesworth Street in Dublin, is expected to be served in the coming days. Mr Lyons is named in the writ lodged in the High Court in Belfast on September 10, which afforded the order 21 days to have an appearance entered on behalf of the Grand Lodge. In February 2007, the Antrim Provincial Lodge was rocked after secretly taped recordings of meetings held in its Rosemary Street Hall in Belfast were sent in the post to members of the lodge. The [PSNI](#) was asked to investigate the incident, but detectives told the Masons that they were unable to establish that a criminal offence had been committed. Since then, there have been attempts to resolve the issues which have caused friction within the Antrim Masons, which is thought to have around 7,000 members. Within the Masonic, the official line has been that the dispute was resolved through Grand Lodge-directed mediation, but the High Court writ issued 10 days ago by the Hoods against [John Dunlop](#), the Provincial Grand Master of [Antrim](#) and the general secretary of the Masons in Ireland, has stunned the membership. Businessman Brian Hood declined to discuss any details of the action, but did say: "I can confirm that my father and I have laid the writ. We are happy to be Freemasons but are appalled at the conduct of the management of the Provincial Lodge of Antrim and that is the basis of the writ." "It is our intention

to have a court hearing. If we cannot get a fair hearing and justice within the Masonic Order, then we have to seek justice elsewhere and take steps to have injustice addressed," he said.

In a quarterly communication in June 2007, posted on its website, the Grand Lodge of Ireland included a minute referring to the dispute in Antrim.

"The assistant grand master reported on the findings of the sub-committee chaired by himself, set up to consider complaints between Brethren in Antrim and Senior Provincial Grand Lodge Officers in Antrim. "The sub-committee proposed that the dispute be referred to mediation and the board approved the proposal, the deputy grand master to facilitate this," it said.

In June of last year, the Grand Lodge website assured members that the dispute in the Antrim Lodge had been resolved.

"Through its essential quality of compromise, mediation has been successful in achieving a mutual solution to all aspects of the dispute," it said. "It can now be confidently assumed that this denouement is the definitive closure of the dispute in the best interests of Irish Freemasonry, without fear of any latent negative developments or any interpretation of the compromise achieved as a winner/loser scenario. . ."

When asked last week whether the Antrim Provincial grand master and the general secretary would defend the writ, a member of staff at the Masons Rosemary Street office in Belfast would only say: "We are not making any comment at the moment."

Meanwhile, Easons has distributed 30,000 copies of the new Dan Brown book to their stores all over the country -- the biggest initial order they have placed since the last [Harry Potter](#) novel.
